

#### Improving the health of all ages and abilities

People of all ages can learn and benefit from the gentle turning and stretching movements of Taoist Tai Chi<sup>†</sup> internal arts and methods, and adaptations can be made to match any level of ability. It is a self-regulated form of exercise that lends itself to the needs of all participants. Senior citizens are offered discounted membership dues and young and old alike enjoy the friendly and welcoming nature of the Society.

#### Health recovery classes

Health recovery classes are specialised classes which enable people with chronic illnesses, or those who are recovering from injuries, to incorporate Taoist Tai Chi<sup>†</sup> internal arts and methods into their recovery as a complementary therapy. Movements can be adapted for those with reduced mobility. These classes are offered at selected branches and sometimes as part of hospital and other therapeutic programs.



People of all ages and abilities enjoy the friendly atmosphere of the Society.


#### Beginning classes


They both were from sizeable Dutch families, and fell in love back in 1959.

# In the kitchen with Mitchell



## CHINESE TOMATO AND EGG SOUP

This inexpensive and easy to make soup is really good in the colder months.

I made it recently for my
Dom-Man Sir L, who enjoyed it immensely.

Ingredients you will need:

One Spring Onion - chopped
Two x 50g firm ripe tomatoes - peeled and diced

Two eggs - beaten One Tablespoon Oil One Litre Stock -

I use Massel Chicken style Stock
One Tablespoon Light Soy Sauce I use Pearl River Bridge
One Tablespoon Cornflour.

Heat the oil over a high heat until very hot (I use my clay pot, but you can use a Wok, or even a saucepan), add the spring onions and stir-fry for a few seconds to add flavour to the oil.

Pour in the stock then bring to the boil.

Add the tomatoes and return to the boil.

Add the soy sauce and slowly pour in the eggs, stirring as you pour.

Return to the boil.

Combine the corn flour with enough water to make a paste.

Add to the soup and simmer until it thickens - Serve and enjoy.
