At an election held on 9th April 2014, a change in the positions of MAG's President & Secretary were made. Likewise there are some new faces on the Committee. I thank these guys for coming forward to steer MAG into the future. I would like to thank the past Presidents of MAG for their contribution towards to ongoing success of our group. I also place on record my thanks to all who have held official positions on the MAG Committee over the past 22 years, and the many, many guys who have helped in various ways to ensure our meetings are successful and other functions are enjoyable for those guys who did attend them. I was MAG's Secretary from 2001 to 2013. In 2014 the new President. I look forward to the challenges ahead.

MAG is no longer a Project of ACON. We are a social group of gay and bi-sexual men meeting in the ACON Building. I thank ACON for their support of MAG, and for their continued support through a Memorandum of Understand signed in February 2014.

My first challenge is work through the legalities of having a Constitution, then to registered it with the NSW Government's Department of Fair Trading. Obtain a registered Incorporated name, and a registered ABN. Last and very importantly, MAG becoming a Registered Charity, so we can seek funding from NSW Government organisations and other bodies plus have fund raising events.

With everyone's support I see this not as a challenge, but taking MAG into the gay world from ACON's protection.

The preparation of a Constitution will be the first item, I commence with. I have been referred to TARS for their assistance in preparing a draft Constitution. It will then be discussed by your Committee, who in turn will ask all financial member to comment of the draft. We will then make alterations to the draft, if any.

The Constitution will be then considered at a Special Meeting and hopefully it will adopt the Constitution.

We will then forward it to the NSW Dept. of Fair Trading for their approval.

I cannot stress enough the support of our members. All guys who attend MAG Meetings in future will ALL need to be financial members. This is another way MAG can move forward with everyone sharing the load, financially & socially. Should anyone require further information, please ring me on 9516 2063. Then be come a registered Charity - 'a not for profit organisation' to raise funds.

Wrath now moved the priest. "Will you, for the fear of experiencing a small shame, incur a great one? This is an order from the Almighty: Let all virgins stand!"


And as his thunderous tones died away, a young lady, far in the rear, with a baby in her arms, rose bashfully.

I can still remember being astonished by Wran's comments on the news on the Sunday after the '78 Mardi Gras with words to the effect that 'THE GAYS HAD HAD ENOUGH AND HAD OVER STEPPED THE MARK' when in reality it was the local Darlinghurst police who did that in voiding a legal permit. Yet, Wran's government did repeal the Summary Offences Act and did introduce Anti-discrimination protection for less bians and gay communities, his is a mixed legacy.


