The service operates in Sydney as well as the Hunter, Nepean, Illawarra and Central Coast regions.

The service is available to recipients of Australian Government subsidised Home Care Packages who have been identified by their aged care provider as experiencing or at risk of experiencing social isolation, whether for social or cultural reasons or because of disability.

Marcantonio's Aussie Retro Mulberry & Rosella Desert.

Men of my generation, the post war kids, remember the old Mulberry tree as well as the Rosella bushes that used to grow in just about every one's back yard. Back in those day's our mums made jams and pies with these fruits. Sadly with affluence and gentrification of those suburbs in the 1970's, the Mulberry tree and Rosella have all but disappeared. So imagine my delight when I saw for the first time in decades at **Bondi Junction's Norton St Grocer** punnets of Mulberries. Mulberries are seasonal fruits from late October to mid-December where as Wild Hibiscus [Rosella] can be found at the check-out of any reputable bottle shop.



Ingredients: Note one Punnet of Mulberries and one jar of Wild Hibiscus serves two.

One Punnet Mulberries.

Wild Hibiscus: Flowers in Syrup [Rosellas]

Gippsland Thickened Crème.

Sugar and a little bit of orange juice.

Presentation is everything: Use a stemmed water goblet chilled in the 'fridge for this.

First with the juice of an orange line the rim of the goblets with juice [just like a Margarita] then dip into a plate of sugar.

Cut the green stems off the Mulberries then place in a colander and rinse gently in cold water.

Then place in them in the 'fridge along with the jar of Wild Hibiscus – Rosellas.

When ready to serve, place gently a few Mulberries at the bottom of each of the chilled goblets then layer a few Rosellas along with some of the syrup. Repeat until both Mulberries and Rosellas are used up.

Finally add a large dollop of Gippsland Thickened Crème.

Note: If you wish to serve this as a very "posh" desert serve this with a chilled glass of **Apera** [can't call it "sherry" any more] I would recommend...

Sánchez Romate NPU Amontillado: It has lovely amber tones as well as hint of almond aromas along with a touch of oak which gives it a taste that is dry, persistent and unusually delicate. Enjoy!!!!
